#### What are the questions?

A. What is the effect of U.S. petroleum security on foreign policy?

Or

B. What is the effect of U.S. foreign policy on petroleum?

It depends on...

What we <u>see</u>, and what we see depends on what we believe.

# Two Theories in Security Studies (what we believe and thus "see")

#### 1. Realism

- Human nature is flawed
- Humans and nations desire power
- World stage: competition, anarchy
- U.S. can't solve all of world's problems
- Containment





# Two Theories in Security Studies (what we believe and thus "see")

#### 2. Neo-liberalism

- -Human nature is complex, but...
- -People have a moral compass
- -Cooperation possible, based on trust
- -Republics are the highest form of gov't
- -Peace secured through spread of freedom, to include free trade





## "Security Dilemma"

#### **Assumptions**:


- 1. People and states need to feel secure
- 2. People and states <u>will take action</u> to ensure security

#### **Problem:**

Actions affect others

#### Dilemma:

How do we <u>interpret</u> their actions? What should be our response?





## Security Dilemmas #2 & #3

- A. How do we <u>interpret</u> possible disruptions to oil supply? (*petroleum security*)
- B. What should be our <u>response</u>? (foreign policy)

Disruption to Oil Security	Interpretation	U.S. Response (foreign policy)
1973 OPEC cuts prod. & imposes embargo	Arab states engaged in econ warfare w/US & Israel	Kissinger gets Israel to w/d from Sinai and GH
1990 Saddam invades Kuwait	Saddam wants to control M.E. oil	1991 US invades Iraq

#### **Different perspectives** → **Different answers**

**Security Dilemma #4**: What would a poor and destitute Saudi Arabia do to our security?

Realist	Neo-liberal
Our job isn't to bring freedom, econ dev, or even peace to Saudi Arabia.	Our job is to promote peace through trade, because this is how we secure <u>our</u> peace, (and because it's moral).
Our job is to do only what we can, which is limited.	Preserve relationships and trust.
Focus on American interests.	Certainly develop U.S. oil supplies, but keep trading with S.A.
Develop domestic oil supplies and build up our military (for our protection).	Assist S.A. developing other sectors of their economy.







## Dr. Chanis: 6 Phases in U.S. History (since 1900)


















### Dr. Stern: A Different Hypothesis

Aggressive U.S. foreign policy

#### Key arguments

- "Peak oil" always flawed
- Assumes no change in technology or new discoveries
- We will never "run out" of oil we will use less and use substitutes if it gets too expensive
- Our "enemies" still want cash: Iran, SH, Russia will still sell their oil to world markets
- We can always buy from the market, we don't need to but directly from countries
